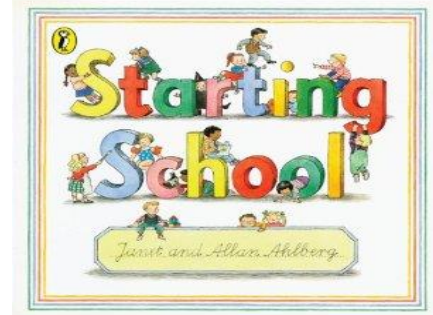

What is the PEDS? -

Parents' evaluation of development status

Ten simple questions can help identify childhood developmental issues

PEDS is a set of 10 simple questions that parents or carers complete to help identify and address any concerns you may have about your child's development, health and wellbeing.

The Parents' Evaluation of Development Status (PEDS) is included in the [Personal Health Record](#) (also known as the 'red book') provided to the parents of every newborn in Queensland. The PEDS is designed to pick up developmental and behavioural issues in children aged from birth up to five years. Early identification means children can be referred to services that will help ensure they reach their full potential.
